Firefighter Stephen Gerald Siller was assigned to Brooklyn's Squad 1, in September of 2001. On September 11, 2001, he had just finished his shift and was on his way to play golf with his brothers when he was informed of a plane hitting the North Tower of the World Trade Center. He immediately called his wife Sally and had her inform his brothers he would catch up with them later. He returned to Squad 1 to get his gear.

Stephen drove his truck to the entrance of the Brooklyn Battery Tunnel, but it had been closed off for security purposes. Stephen was determined to carry out his duty and strapped 60lbs of fireman's gear on his back. He raced on foot through the tunnel and to the Twin Towers. Stephen paid the ultimate sacrifice as he gave up his own life in his attempt to save others. Stephen left behind his wife Sally, five wonderful children, family and friends. Stephen grew up under the guiding philosophy of St. Francis of Assisi, and embodied Assisi's encouraging and inspirational phrase "while we have time, let us do good."

After his death and as a way to remember his legacy and the inspirational phrase "while we have time, let us do good," the Tunnel to Towers Foundation was

created. 95 cents of every dollar donated goes directly to the programs of Tunnel to Towers. One of the most notable is the Fallen First Responder Home Program, which aims to pay off the mortgages of fallen law enforcement officers and firefighters who lose their lives in the line of duty and leave behind young children. The Foundation's goal is to ensure stability and security for these families facing sudden and tragic loss.

Tunnel to Towers Foundation has graciously assisted the families of Tpr. Branden Tyler Sisca and Tpr. Martin Francis Mack III of the Pennsylvania State Police. Sisca and Mack were killed in a line of duty vehicle crash on March 21, 2022. Sisca and Mack were assisting a pedestrian on I-95 when they were struck by a drunk driver. Both Sisca and Mack left behind a wife and children. Tunnel To Towers donated and raised funds to pay off the family's mortgages.

They have also graciously assisted the family of Deputy U. S. Marshal Christopher Hill. Hill was shot and killed in Harrisburg, PA on January 18, 2018, while serving an arrest warrant. Chris Hill also left behind a wife and two children. Tunnel to Towers donated and raised funds to pay off the family's mortgage.

The mission of the program is to create and support one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of youth.

The Bigs in Blue Program is a unique and enriching one on one mentorship opportunity that connects at-risk students with a member of law enforcement. These interactions help to establish and develop a friendship based upon consistency, trust, and understanding. Though the student's mentor in this program is involved in law enforcement and wearing a uniform, the Trooper/Officer does not meet with the student to serve as a disciplinary figure. The relationship developed offers a more humanistic approach. The youth is able to see the Trooper/Officer as a role model, support system, and a present adult willing to devote time, insight, kindness to support the needs of the youth. Whether it's through eating lunch, playing a game, hanging out at recess, or a problem-solving homework assignment, Bigs in Blue allows students of diverse and often troubled backgrounds feel valued and empowered, all while positively bridging the gap between law enforcement and members of the community
